


Demographics of Tribe and Housing Authority

- The Peoria Tribe is located in Miami, Oklahoma
- We currently have an enrollment of 2,900 Tribal members
- The Peoria Tribal operations and Housing Authority employ 39 persons.



Cont'd

- **The Peoria Tribe and Housing Authority work in partnership with the Ottawa Tribe of Oklahoma. We manage 127 low-rent units in various communities; lease-to-own 186 homes , and 29 fair-market value homes throughout Ottawa and Delaware Counties located in Northeast Oklahoma.**



Project Overview

- The Peoria Housing Authority is honored to be awarded the “First Steps Toward Tribal Weatherization-Human Capacity Development” grant.
- This will provide us the opportunity to receive training on current up to date practices concerning weatherization techniques.

Cont'd

- This will enable staff to make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners about future grants to pursue home efficiency upgrades for our homeowners.



On-Going and Current Projects

- With our current award from the Department of Energy, we look forward to the final determination for training.
 - We are just breaking ground on our new Low Rent development.
 - 12 new low-rent dwellings for an additional 28 Native American families at our Miami site.

- The new units will consist of energy efficient add-ons that will help our Low-income Native American families
- For example:
 - 2X6 Exterior Walls Made Of Galvanized Steel
 - Full Brick Apartments
 - Geothermal Units For Heating And Cooling
 - Low E Energy Efficient Rated Windows
 - 5 Star Rated Energy Efficient Appliances
 - Polaralum-A Heat Barrier System ©
