


Role of ONAP

- The role of ONAP is to:
 - ✓ Assist tribes in the provision of housing to Native American families,
 - ✓ Provide funds for creating economic opportunities for tribes and Indian housing residents,
 - ✓ Assist tribes to formulate plans and strategies for community development,
 - ✓ Ensure fiscal integrity in the operation of programs.



ONAP Locations




NAHASDA OVERVIEW



History

- NAHASDA signed into law 10/26/96
- Provides tribes with block grant:
 - ✓ New flexibilities
 - ✓ New responsibilities
- Program and funds called Indian Housing Block Grant (IHBG)



Indian Housing Block Grant Program (IHBG)

- IHBG grants based on formula, which takes into account:
 - ✓ Requirement to maintain tribe's current assisted housing stock,
 - ✓ Need for additional low-income housing.
- Indian Housing Plans are required prior to receiving IHBG funding.



Eligible IHBG Activities

- Benefits low-income Indian families
- IHBG affordable housing activities include:
 - ✓ Housing assistance,
 - ✓ Development (includes new construction, rehab, energy efficiency improvements)
 - ✓ Housing services,
 - ✓ Housing management services,
 - ✓ Crime prevention,
 - ✓ Model activities.



IHBG Funding

- Fiscal Year 2011 National allocation is \$658,349,443
- Fiscal year 2011 IHBG Funding for Region VIII grantees was \$93,501,731
- Fiscal Year 2010 IHBG Funding for Region VIII grantees was \$97,500,605
- Fiscal Year 2009 IHBG Funding for Region VIII grantees was \$91,898,496
